



- Five Local Net Zero Hubs across England North East & Yorkshire, North West, Midlands, Greater South East and South West
- Funded and directed as part of the Local Net Zero Programme within The Department for Energy Security and Net Zero (The Department)

The North East and Yorkshire Net Zero Hub

 The North East and Yorkshire (NEY) Net Zero Hub is at the centre of the region's ambitious efforts to drive a low-carbon, clean-growth future.

Our Hub combines six Combined Authorities (CAs) and Local Enterprise Partnerships (LEPs) in the region, bringing local authorities, businesses, organisations and communities together to help us achieve our goals.

A Net Zero Hub Manager and small core team are based in Tees Valley Combined Authority with a Hub funded Energy Project Manager based in each of our six CA/LEP areas, driving the transition to a zero carbon economy with ambitious energy strategy and innovative project delivery.

All projects expected to provide a minimum of 30%

match of the total project costs.

This applies to both development and delivery applications.

 Preference is that match comes from organisation reserves, bank funding, crowd funding, etc.

If you intend to use pre-existing grant funding from a different source, please ensure that this is permitted within the guidelines of that grant funding. If you're unsure, please query with the grant provider and the Hub.






Hub Strategic Priorities

Eligibility


All applicants, funding invested, and associated outputs must be located within the NEY Net Zero Hub's geography.

The following organisations are eligible to apply*:

- Public Sector (incl. LAs, CAs, NHS, etc)
- Schools and Education Providers
- Charities/Third Sector
- Community Groups
- Parish Councils
- Faith Groups

*subject to compliance with UK Subsidy Control Regulations

All projects must directly deliver at least one of the Hub's strategic priorities.





Development Funding -Overview

Grants of between £10,000 and £50,000 available

Development stream grants aimed at preparing projects for delivery

 Overarching output – a project that is investment ready by 31st March 2024


 EPEF will not fund feasibility studies – expectation that this has already been completed prior to application





Development Funding – Eligible Costs

- Site surveys
- Planning application fees
- Grid DNO application costs
- Legal fees
- Professional/consultancy fees
- Project management fees
- Project development costs (as agreed by the NZ Hub)
- Financial and Business Case development
- Internal labour costs only where there is a compelling case and the market is not able to supply or provide value. If supported, this would be at base salary rate





- Grants of between £50,000 £100,000 available for the delivery of energy projects
- At least one of the priority targets must be achieved by the project:
 - CO2 savings achieved
 - Installed energy generation technology
 - Installed energy storage technology
 - Follow-on investment/commercial leverage
- Projects may also achieve ancillary targets of creating or safeguarding jobs





Delivery Funding — Eligible Costs

- Equipment, plant, and machinery
- Low carbon/renewable energy technology installations
- Groundworks/building works and other necessary preparation works
- Site surveys, mitigations or other abnormal costs associated with project construction or installation
- Internal labour costs only where there is a compelling case and the market is not able to supply or provide value. If supported, this would be at base salary rate







- The second round of the Energy Project Enabling Fund will be open for applications from 03/05/23
- This fund will close for applications on 16/06/23
- The appraisal process will take place between 19/06/23 and 04/08/23.
- Recommended projects will be presented to the Hub Board during the August Board meeting week commencing 07/08/23.
- Successful applicants will be notified by no later than 18/08/23.
