# Advanced Zoning Programme - Market Engagement Webinars

As part of the government's plan to accelerate the delivery of heat networks across England in areas where zones are likely to be designated in the future, the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero is supporting a number of towns and cities through the **Advanced Zoning Programme (AZP)** prior to Heat Network Zoning legislation coming into place. Leeds, Sheffield and Newcastle are all AZP cities.

As work on the programme progresses and to support the supply chain to prepare for these opportunities, DESNZ has been delivering a series of market engagement webinars to showcase the opportunities coming to the market.

# Clean Energy Jobs Plan published

This Clean Energy Jobs Plan sets out how the government will work in partnership with industry and trade unions to help workers in all parts of the country benefit from opportunities across clean energy industries - supporting our existing workforce to find new opportunities, training up the next generation, and supporting our young people to get good jobs.

Specific reference is made to Heat Networks when introducing 'clean energy jobs'. It's also acknowledged that sector cuts across traditional industries such as manufacturing, construction, and professional business services. The plan ties in directly with the levels of growth expected for the Heat Network industry. Heat networks currently provide almost 3% of UK heat demand – we are aiming for 20% by 2050.

Developing heat networks across the country has the potential to create tens of thousands of jobs, across many different disciplines, through delivering a low-carbon heating transformation.

## National Wealth Fund backs Hull city centre heat network

In October the National Wealth Fund announced financing for Hull City Council's District Heat Network (HDHN). Hull was one of 28 local authority partners to participate in the Heat Network Zone Identification Pilot which tested and helped to develop the heat network zoning framework. A zone opportunity report was produced for the city and can be found here.

The network (which will be constructed, operated and maintained by Vital Energi) will provide low-carbon, reliable heat to buildings across the city centre and is only the second local authority heat network to be backed by the NWF – a huge achievement by the team at Hull and incredibly exciting for the region!

# TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

#### **Heat Training Grant Renewal**

An extra £5m has been provided to continue the Heat Training Grant, until March 2026.

The Heat Training Grant provides vouchers of up to £500 to support trainees in England taking courses relevant to heat pumps and heat networks and has
