POLICY & FUNDING UPDATES

FairHeat and HNTAS

FairHeat has now been officially appointed by the **Department for Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ)** to deliver the HNTAS Interim Technical Support contract, continuing their role as the Lead Technical Author for the **Heat Network Technical Assurance Scheme**.

This follows three years of close collaboration with DESNZ and industry stakeholders to develop the technical foundation of HNTAS, including the draft Code documents, TS1, metering & monitoring frameworks, guidance materials and key governance structures. Under this new contract, FairHeat will support DESNZ in finalising and expanding the technical requirements of the scheme ahead of its introduction in 2026.

Heat Network Efficiency Scheme (HNES) – Round 11 open for applications

HNES provides funding to public, private and third sector applicants in England and Wales, to support improvements to existing district heating or communal heating projects for customers and operators.

Round 11 of funding is now open for applications until **Friday February 6th**. Updated [guidance](#) for applicants has also been published and includes updates to the Heat Network Metering and Billing Regulations (HNMBR) requirements and new references to the Ofgem digital service.

Requirement to Connect

A question many of you have been asking over recent months is when we might have some more detail on the potential 'Requirement to Connect' to Heat Networks, where there are HNs available to connect to. It remains at the top of Zoning Implementation team's FAQ list and we recently received some official lines from colleagues at DESNZ. Here's what we know so far:

From 2026 heat network zoning will identify areas of England where heat networks are the lowest cost, low-carbon heating solution.

As a result, we expect heat network developers to engage proactively with building owners to encourage connections to the heat network.

However, there will be a legal backstop allowing for certain types of buildings to be required to connect to a heat network within a zone. These buildings must connect to the network within a specific timeframe.

Building owners will be able to apply for an exemption from the requirement to connect, if they meet certain criteria. For example, if a low carbon heating technology is already installed or if there are structural incompatibilities with connecting the building to a heat network.

Details of the types of buildings required to connect will be provided in the zoning consultation, which is anticipated to be released early this year. As soon as we know more, I'll make sure that the information is disseminated as quickly and clearly as possible. **In the meantime, if you have any queries or concerns you'd like adding to our FAQ list, please do get in touch.**
